



INSTRUMENT RATING COURSE DESCRIPTION

COURSE OVERVIEW

Welcome to 360 Aviation's Instrument Rating Course (Airplane). You are about to join the ranks of pilots who have furthered their education with 360 Aviation, LLC. and exceeded the industry's expectations for pilots by going above and beyond the check ride. The 10-Day Instrument Rating Course will teach you to safely navigate the national airspace system under Instrument Flight Rules (IFR). This course is designed to get you through the instrument rating quickly, while still gaining the advanced experience necessary to be safe and proficient. We will work with you during the day, but you must work each night reviewing ground and flight items introduced that day, as well as previously taught subjects. Personal preparation and studying will allow you to pass the check ride with ease.

PREREQUISITES PRIOR TO STARTING

- \$500 deposit to 360 Aviation, LLC.
 - Deposit will be taken off course fee price upon arrival
 - This deposit secures your scheduled start date with us and is non refundable.
- Original Birth Certificate or U.S. Passport
 - No Flight Training can take place until this is received!
- FAA Private Pilot Airplane Certificate
- Instrument Rating Airplane Written Test Passed
- Current FAA Medical (3rd Class minimum)
- 40 hours of cross-country flight time
 - If short of these hours, prior arrangements can be made. **Additional Fees Apply**
- 10 hours of instrument time (actual or simulated)
 - Can be conducted with a safety pilot. If short, arrangements can be made

PILOT SUPPLIES TO BRING

- Government Issued Photo ID (Driver's License, Passport, Military ID)
- Private Pilot Certificate (Plastic Card and English Proficient)
- Current 3rd Class Medical or greater
- Pilot Logbook(s) with flight times totaled
- Written Test (IRA) Original Copy
- Check for Examiner
- Headset (Dual Plug GA)
- Notebook and writing utensils

COURSE FEE OPTION

The course fee option guarantees one of our instructors will work with you each day, on the ground and in the air. The average length for the instrument rating is 10 days. If needed we will provide an additional two days at no extra cost (up to 12 days included in the course fee). If there is a weather or maintenance delay you will not be charged for the extra time. However, if you require additional training or leave for any reason, you will then be charged an hourly or daily rate.

FINISH-UPS

There are opportunities if you have already started your training and are looking to build experience or finish your Instrument Rating. The course fee is the best option for someone looking to complete the entire course with us, but a daily fee can be arranged if needed.
